DBS UPDATE

Scorers

As a matter of good governance, the ECB regularly reviews its safeguarding guidance to ensure it reflects the latest in safeguarding best practice. The role of a scorer was reviewed last year, and the legal advice received indicated that in general the role of a scorer does not in law meet the threshold to be a role requiring an enhanced DBS check. These requirements are set and applied in law. Our guidance was updated as a result. However, there may be scenarios where a scorer moves into regulated activity and an enhanced DBS would be required.

Safe Hands Management System

The Safe Hands Management System (SHMS) is an online Club Management Tool introduced in 2021 to support clubs in proactively managing safeguarding. All of our clubs have now been invited to onboard onto the SHMS with many of our clubs pro-actively using the system to manage their safeguarding provision. The ECB are continuing to review the existing compliance rules to ensure that they remain fit-for-purpose in allowing clubs to demonstrate their commitment to safeguarding in the recreational game. For now, we would advise clubs do the following:

- Ensure all data on the SHMS is up to date prior to the start of the 2024 season and that your club portal is an accurate reflection of your volunteer workforce.
- Initiate any required DBS checks
- Update & complete all sections on the portal that are relevant to your club even if this means you are not able to meet all requirements to achieve club compliance

If clubs are required to reach a state of club compliance for a specific purpose (e.g. Clubmark accreditation) then we will review this on a club-by-club basis.

Safe Hands Guidance and new Safeguarding Club Policy Template

- The ECB Safeguarding Team have been reviewing and updating the Safe Hands Policy, Guidance and Template documents. The ECB Safe Hands Policy has been updated and approved by the ECB Board and can be found here.
- There is a requirement for recreational clubs to hold a safeguarding policy. The ECB are now asking clubs to complete a new Safeguarding Policy Statement which asks them to agree to Safe Hands being the single safeguarding policy for the game. This will hopefully be seen as a positive step forward, to reduce the workload for our volunteer Club Safeguarding Officers and provide consistency across the club network.

SAFEGUARDING FOR SPECIALIST ROLES

These courses are for all those who have a specialist role in cricket including Coaches, Activators, Officials, Committee Members, Captains and Club Safeguarding Officers. If you perform a specialist role in cricket you need to complete the 'Safeguarding for Specialist Roles' and the the appropriate top up module related to your role. - Safeguarding for Captains and Team Managers
- Safeguarding for Coaches and Activators
- Safeguarding for Officials (Umpires and Scorers)
- Safeguarding for Committee Members and Club Safeguarding Officers

The Safeguarding for Specialist Roles training should take around 1 hour to complete and the top up modules around 20 minutes. Your certificate is available to download on completing the top up module and is valid for 3 years.

If you perform more than one such role, we suggest you choose the element most aligned to your main role. Whilst there is only a need to complete one top-up module, you are welcome to complete as many as you wish. Volunteers can access the additional top up modules by auto enrolling on each module in their e-learning account.

If you have previously completed the Online Safeguarding Young Cricketers module or have a current ECB e-learning account, the new Safeguarding for Specialist roles qualification unique to your role will be available in your e-learning account for volunteers to complete.
