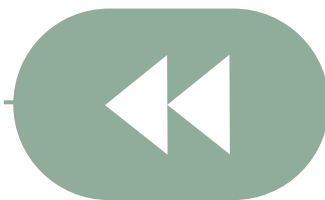

Throughout the whole year Wiltshire Cricket runs festivals, with indoor festivals taking place during the winter terms when the weather is not usually the best for cricket outdoors. In 2022-2023 we delivered both Key Stage 1 and Key stage 2 Indoor festivals in January, February and March at multiple locations across Wiltshire



Young Leaders

Wiltshire Cricket were active in the running and facilitating of 17 qualifying competitions and 3 County Finals for the outdoor Dynamos Schools competitions (mixed and girls only).

To enable us to complete the festivals in a fair, timely and organised fashion, we were delighted and grateful to receive support from students at our local secondary schools.

Across all of the 21 competition days which took place during Term Five and Six, only three festivals did not have support from Young Leaders from schools across the county
